Bruce (bruce.mowbray): i thought you entrance was quite fashionable, Zen -- not too early -- not to late...
in fact, I'm a bit jealous of it, because when I arrived, no one was here to SEE ,e.
Zen (zen.arado): they do it for badness
Bruce (bruce.mowbray): your*
Bruce (bruce.mowbray): /me meant to type -- No one was here to SEE me.
Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Aww
Bruce (bruce.mowbray): /me is jealous of everyone else's typing skills.
Zen (zen.arado): trtying to find a way into the topic
Zen (zen.arado): what did you thnk of the article?
Zen (zen.arado): is the author going too far
Zen (zen.arado): he seems to think our ideas about being true to just one partner are outdated
Zen (zen.arado): 'that Buddhist principles can be, and should be, extended to the realm of intimate
relationships.'
Aggers (agatha.macbeth): People have been saying that for years
Zen (zen.arado): have they?
Aggers (agatha.macbeth): AFAIK
Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Since the 60s at least
Zen (zen.arado): I was surpried to see it in a Buddhist article
Zen (zen.arado): most seem to adhere to strict monogamy
Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Nothing about Buddhist articles would surprise me:p
Zen (zen.arado): free love?
Aggers (agatha.macbeth): If it's free I'll take one
Zen (zen.arado)::)
Wol Euler::)
Mila (milakel): hi:)
Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Here comes Mila!
Wol Euler: hello mila
Zen (zen.arado): Hi Mila:)
Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Mila!
Aphrodite Macbain: I'd take love anytime
Mila (milakel): what meeting is that?
Mila (milakel): oh, new furry girl:)
Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Who?
Aphrodite Macbain: Wol
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Aggers (agatha.macbeth): She's been furry for a week now

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): or more

Wol Euler: no, you've seen this av before. You just didn't notice

Mila (milakel): in little black polka dots:)
Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Well spotted

Wol Euler::)

Mila (milakel): horns:)

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Antlers

Mila (milakel): ah

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): /me nods Mila (milakel): antlers sounds better

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): I've never seen Wol horny:D

Mila (milakel): huh?:)

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): That's what I said....

Wol Euler: /me chokes on her tea and makes spluttering noises

Mila (milakel): hehe

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Zen, I'd really like to hear an "I-statement" from you about your opinion (feeling, resentment, agreement, etc.) regarding Buddhism, jealousy -- and (if you wish) the matter of monogamy, celibacy, open-relationships, etc.

Mila (milakel): that's like asking for the meaning of life, bruce:)

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): 42?

Zen (zen.arado): I read a book called 'The Ethical Slut' recently

Mila (milakel): oh, do tell more

Wol Euler: /me grins.

Zen (zen.arado): and it has given me a lot to think about

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Well, Zen has raised those specific topics -- so I'd like to hear more from him.

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Agreed

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): and from anyone else who has feeling about these things.

Wol Euler: http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/The Ethical Slut

Zen (zen.arado): the authors raise a lot of good [points

Zen (zen.arado): I made some notes

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Now I know two people named Lizt

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): +s

Zen (zen.arado): Why is it ok for men to be 'stud's' but women being 'sluts' is so frowned upon in Western societies?

Aphrodite Macbain: It's easier to be one than be with one, I would think

Wol Euler: /me nods.

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): ;-)

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): 'sex is nice and pleasure is good for you' Zen (zen.arado): so there are double standards for men and women

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): I like it

Mila (milakel): quote: The authors define the term slut as "a person of any gender who has the courage to lead life according to the radical proposition that sex is nice and pleasure is good for you."

Wol Euler: /me smiles.

Aphrodite Macbain: The authors define the term slut as "a person of any genderr

Mila (milakel): aren't we all sluts?

Wol Euler: no, mila

Mila (milakel): according to this definition

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): IMHO, men are far more insecure in their sexuality, generally, than women are — and far more insecure in their relationships — so they make rules that restrict women to a narrower range of behaviors than they would restrict themselves to...

Wol Euler: many people act as though they felt that sex was basically wrong

Mila (milakel): isn't sex nice and pleasure is good?

Zen (zen.arado): we seem to have so many hang ups in this area

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): (But would prefer to keep the topic on 'Jealousy' than to go off into sexual equality...)

Zen (zen.arado): so many myths and prejudices

Aphrodite Macbain: it's about who'sin control, isn't it?

Zen (zen.arado): yeh but the main point is how jealousy is linked to monogamy

Mila (milakel): woly, well... is it still so widespread?

Zen (zen.arado): the idea that my partner is 'mine' for mu exclusive use

Mila (milakel): zen, good point... is it selfishness? lack of trust?

Aphrodite Macbain: if we were polygamous, would there be no jealousy?

Wol Euler: /me raises an eyebrow at "use", but nods.

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): or maybe it's about who has the bigger Ego --- by which I mean, who has the ego consolidation... that has to "identify" with THINGS he has -- like sexual partners...

Zen (zen.arado): Buddhism ask us to give love to everyone

Aphrodite Macbain: there are may kinds of love

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): True Aph

Aphrodite Macbain: we are talking about romantic and sexual love

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Indeed, there are many kinds of loving -- Personally, I don't see how it's possible to ove one person without loving everyone else (including yourself) at the same time.

Zen (zen.arado): that possessiveness is where the jealousy comes from

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Yes

Zen (zen.arado): but what kind of love Bruce?

Zen (zen.arado): not sexual love

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Perhaps there is confusion (Buddhists might call it illusion) - if one's lover is a "possession" ---

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): I think it hold for EVERY sort of true love ---

Zen (zen.arado): but that's mostly how we think of a partner isn't it?

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): How can I make love (pysically -- were I not a monk for 30 years...) to someone without making love to the entire cosmos - simultaneously?

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): For me that's simply not a possibility.

Zen (zen.arado): there are words like 'betrayal' cheating for those who have relations with someone else Aphrodite Macbain: I wonder if it's built into our genetic code- to be possessive about our sexual partner Bruce (bruce.mowbray): I have NEVER thought of a partner as a "possession." I do't even think of my DOG as a possession.

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): don't\*

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): He'll bite you if you do Aphrodite Macbain: what would be a better word? Aphrodite Macbain: is it not natural to feel jealous?

Zen (zen.arado): but would you be happy if they had relations with other men?

Zen (zen.arado): the author of the Buddhst article says' most human mating mechanisms and responses are actually "living fossils" shaped by the genetic pressures of our evolutionary history. The problem, of course, is that patterns that were adaptive millions of years ago might be anything but that today.'

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Yes, I am familiar with words like "betrayal" and "cheating" --- some folks also use such words in regard to their political affiliations, or to their nation... But, I don't buy into such

Aphrodite Macbain: yes- we're hard wired

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): nor do I buy the mythology about "possession" of on'e lover(s) - partner(s)

Zen (zen.arado): have any of us felt sexual jealousy?

Zen (zen.arado): I certainly have

Aphrodite Macbain: mythology Bruce?

Aphrodite Macbain: me too

mythologies.

Zen (zen.arado): it is a powerful emotion

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): I guess it's a lot to do with if people want to be possessed or not

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): /me - one more time - realizes that he's was always "wored" differently.

Zen (zen.arado): it often leads to murder

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): wired\*

Aphrodite Macbain: a very destructive one. Like hate

Wol Euler: /me nods. Zen (zen.arado): yes

Aphrodite Macbain: the green-eyed monster that mocks the meat it feeds upon

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): a LOT of mythologies (in fact, MOST of them) lead eventually to murder....

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Murder she wrote

Zen (zen.arado): well it feels real to those who esperience it

Aphrodite Macbain: jealousy doesn't always lead to murder or the world's population would be a lot smaller

Wol Euler::)

Zen (zen.arado): I can learn to deal with it

Mila (milakel): i think we put too much meaning into sexual intercourse. it's infused with a lot of concepts that lead to problems in a relationship.

Zen (zen.arado): too much emphasis maybe Mila?

Aphrodite Macbain: I agree mila - that's what my brain tells me

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Does it not seem to others that "possession" and "jealousy" are examples of a narrowing of experience . . .? As every opinion narrows experience, so does every possession and every attitude of "mine" -- or "I crave that thing, or person, to be MINE."

Mila (milakel): zen, it's almost a synonym for love in our culture

Zen (zen.arado): yes Bruce

Zen (zen.arado): I think that is what the author is getting at

Aphrodite Macbain: Part of what Buddhists call attachement

Zen (zen.arado): the exclusiveness of intimate relationships

Zen (zen.arado): yes Aph

Zen (zen.arado): but marriage is attachment by definition isn't it?

Zen (zen.arado): thee only do I wed

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Legally speaking

Aphrodite Macbain: It's all about who owns the kids and the property

Zen (zen.arado): emotionally too Aga?

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Marriage is a social invention that was born out of ancient attitudes regarding what a "man" and "woman" should be. . .

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): No, I don't believe so

Zen (zen.arado): yes

Aphrodite Macbain: and property

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Fortunately, we are finally breaking out of some of that...

Zen (zen.arado): are they still valid?

Mila (milakel): zne, if not for papers and legal matters, we could easily skip the "attachment" part and just live with a person we love and be happy... in the moment:)

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): They were NEVER valid -- at least the ones I am thinking about now.

Zen (zen.arado): The belief that monogamous heterosexual marriage is the 'right way' is so deeply entrenched in our culture that it is hard to think past or outside it

Zen (zen.arado): (from my notes)

Aphrodite Macbain: Perhaps it's best avaoid having any kind of intimate relationship

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): that's true

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): (Zen)

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): /me agrees with Mila -- I was a far happier person when I was living with the woman I eventually married than AFTER were WERE married.

Mila (milakel): aoh, please no!:)

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): That's when everything went sour.

Zen (zen.arado): or go the other way Aga?

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Of course, this is just my own experience.

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Which other way?

Mila (milakel): aph, i think on the contrary you should celebrate it

Zen (zen.arado): have more than one partner

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Oh I see

Aphrodite Macbain: but it can bring such pain b/c we make ourselves vulnerable

Zen (zen.arado): This belief evolved as a way to cope with environmental conditions that no longer are applicable in our dynamic fast-changing societ

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Well that depends on how the parties concerned feel about it

Aphrodite Macbain: yes

Mila (milakel): aph, we let ourselves feel this way

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): I f a person cannot "handle" himself/herself within intimate relationships (with all that requires), then it would be best (responding to Aph) that he/she avoid such relationships. I do, in fact, avoid them....

Zen (zen.arado): Do we need the same security derived from the family unit nowadays? In poor countries maybe. Perhaps children need a stable family unit as they grow up? I often wondered when young about how readily everyone around me accepted that marriage is a must.

Aphrodite Macbain: I ahve no choice. It bubbles up - amygdila ubre alles

Aphrodite Macbain: uber

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Amy who?

Aphrodite Macbain: sp. sorry

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): but there are all sorts of intimacy - - -

Aphrodite Macbain: the shark brain

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): /me looks around for a shark

Mila (milakel): bruce, can you elaborate on "handling" an intimate relationship? what does it take?

Aphrodite Macbain: they're everywhere!

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Agrees that children need a sane, stable family unit ---

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Sounds fishy to me Aph

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Mine was anything BUT that ---- I'd have been much better off having been raised

by severa; mothers and fathers -- perhaps in a kibbutz.

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): (sp?)

Zen (zen.arado): handling means making sure he/she stays with you happily?

Aphrodite Macbain: the urge to mate and then stay together as a couple happens with swans and some other birds

Aphrodite Macbain: for a practical reason.

Zen (zen.arado): yes Bruce TES authors believe children could benefit fro that type of upbringing

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): "handling" for me, means that you are responsible and mature enough to be in an

intimate relationship -- I know very few individuals who are that mature and responsible, frankly.

Aphrodite Macbain: Kids are happiest growing up in a marriage that has a loving couple at its core

Mila (milakel): hmm

Zen (zen.arado): yes Aph ..that is the main argument against...pair bonding

Zen (zen.arado): I think

Mila (milakel): aph, true that

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): I would tend to agree Aph

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): I don't know whether I can agree with Aph

Wol Euler: my sister and BIL didn'T get married until their kids were out of college:)

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): s point about kids being happy -- I have no experience with that.

Zen (zen.arado): so it is our nature to pair bond and we are stuck with that?

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): But at least they were still together :p

Mila (milakel): woly, very responsible:)

Wol Euler: I agree about the importance of a happy family, but disagree taht this means "marriage"

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): (not me!)

Aphrodite Macbain: It might well be our nature Zen

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): For marriage substitute relationship

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): "Not me" was an answer to Zen's ? about being stuck with pair bonding -- NOT

ME!

Wol Euler: just being pedantic

Zen (zen.arado): a partner relationship can have strict rules too?

Mila (milakel): \*still wonders what the meeting/workshop it is\*

Aphrodite Macbain: being raised in a commune or community with grandmothers and uncles taking care

of the kids could be another alternative

Mila (milakel): zen if that's what a couple wants

Zen (zen.arado): but what about the singles who get left out?

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Yes, Aph.

Wol Euler: was absolutely standard until about five generations ago

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Probably MOST kids in America are NOT being raised by their father AND mother.

Zen (zen.arado): yeh but that avoids the issue of intimate relations

Zen (zen.arado): ust an extended family

Zen (zen.arado): Sexually repressive attitudes seem to have developed in the late 18th century. It seems however that the sexual energy is only driven underground to emerge in ever more outrageous forms.

Zen (zen.arado): do you agreee with that?

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Yes, Zen. . . Let's get back to that topic.

Mila (milakel): "issue of intimate relation" - kind of sad reading this:)

Aphrodite Macbain: But the sexual norms have increased enormously since the 60s. Are people any happier?

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Some would call this human nature -- (consider the Greek tragedies...) not just something that emerged out of the 18th C. ---

Wol Euler: perhaps sexually repressive attitudes weren'T necessary before that, because most people lived in villages where social control was instant and overall

Zen (zen.arado): how do you mean Aph?

Wol Euler: only when people started moving to anonymous cities was it needed

Zen (zen.arado): good point Wol

Zen (zen.arado): suspect there was more 'free love' then

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): /me agrees that rural settings tend to be more conservative (and probably more stable) than urban ones.

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Oh definitely

Aphrodite Macbain: I mean that free love was all the rage in the 60s and now we have gay marriage etc, but I'm not sure if people are any more or less possessive or jealous because of that

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Maybe they are more so

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): good point, Aph.

Zen (zen.arado): but was it ever more than an idea practiceed by a minority?

Aphrodite Macbain: free love?

Zen (zen.arado): ok gay ppl are allowed openness now

Zen (zen.arado): yes

Zen (zen.arado): I remember ppl talked a lot about it in the 60's but not much happened

Zen (zen.arado): or maybe I missed it:)

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): (I missed to too.)

Mila (milakel): zen, it's been practiced by millions of cheating partners each day:)

Aphrodite Macbain: there were alot of babies named "freedom" and 'liberty"

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): miss IT too.

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): missed\*

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): (Whew!)

Aphrodite Macbain: :-) Bruce

Zen (zen.arado): well if the cheating rate is going up why do we still find the institutiin so necessary?

Aphrodite Macbain: I think we reap the "benefits"

Wol Euler: perhaps becuse it is

Wol Euler: to keep ourselves (or the ohters!) in line

Zen (zen.arado): The rise in divorce rates reflects the reality that people are no longer so happy prolonging unsatisfactory marriages and have the necessary economic independence that permits them to leave them.

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): /me cracks the whip

Wol Euler: /me nods. Mila (milakel): aga girl :)

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): :p

Aphrodite Macbain: also people get married more quickly - there is rarely a time for careful reflection,

long engagements etc

Mila (milakel): aph, it depends

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): There are actually TWO institutions, Zen -- the "marriage" that the state recognizes, and the marriage that the church recognizes, and the marriage that the partners themselves recognize. (OK -- THREE institutions.)

Zen (zen.arado): yes

Aphrodite Macbain: They know if it doesn't work, they can easily get divorced

Zen (zen.arado): The rise in divorce rates reflects the reality that people are no longer so happy prolonging unsatisfactory marriages and have the necessary economic independence that permits them to leave them.

Wol Euler: /me nods to Zen. My sis and BIL were happily not-married for over 25 years

Wol Euler: guess how many of hteir married friends managed that?

Zen (zen.arado): drat

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): None?

Aphrodite Macbain: :-)

Wol Euler: (still are happy but now married)

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Good trick

Aphrodite Macbain: The idea of marriage gives me claustrophobia

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Sounds good to me, Wol.

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Me too, Aph.

Aphrodite Macbain: Bad experiences I guess - tho my parents stayed married for over 60 years

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): wow.

Aphrodite Macbain: but they weren't all that happy

Mila (milakel): woly, please convey them my admiration:)

Wol Euler: will do

Zen (zen.arado): yeh mine too

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Strike a medal

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): My parents wanted a separation after ONE day!

Wol Euler: 0.0

Mila (milakel): aga, or crack a whip:)
Wol Euler: did they stay together?
Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Well, yeah

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): but they stuck in our for 30 years "for the sake of the kids" -- who suffered

because of theyr "loyalty to the institution."

Aphrodite Macbain: wow. what did you say to change their minds?

Mila (milakel): one day, interesting

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Well, that's what my mom told me -- that my father wated a divorce after the first night.

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Can't imagine why....;-)

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): I wish my dad has "possessed" a prostitute instead of a wife.... If that's how he tyought about it.

Aphrodite Macbain: Non violent communication - that's the solution! Must go I'm afraid.

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): I gotta go also...

Zen (zen.arado): bye Aph Mila (milakel): aph :) Wol Euler: bye aph, take care; bye bruce

Aphrodite Macbain: Bye

Aphrodite Macbain: Bye! - must find my bike!!

Zen (zen.arado): and Bruce

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Interesting topic, Zen. GOOD LUCK, guy!

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): /me watches everybody run off

Zen (zen.arado): shall we continue next week?

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Yes

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Bye for now, folks. Aggers (agatha.macbeth): and get Gaya back! Mila (milakel): zen, wait... is it the face workshop?

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): Oh -- Do we have a topic for next week?

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): and when is Gaya coming back?

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): And where is Atari?

Mila (milakel): ah! wok

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): It woks well

Zen (zen.arado): don't know Bruce (bruce.mowbray): ok.

Bruce (bruce.mowbray): bfn, then. Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Ah well

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): /me waves

Zen (zen.arado): she just said she was taking a break

Zen (zen.arado): she told all of us

Wol Euler: /me nods.

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): I wasn't listening

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Probably in the kitchen

Zen (zen.arado): well I need some help

Zen (zen.arado): just feel overworked

Wol Euler: /me listens

Zen (zen.arado): SL is turning into a workhouse

Zen (zen.arado): :)

Wol Euler: /me nods.

Zen (zen.arado): everywhere you go they want you to WORK

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Sun too, she never stops

Zen (zen.arado): I know

Mila (milakel): i've re-watched "you've got mail" recently. such a lovely movie.

Zen (zen.arado): and Eliza

Wol Euler: sounds like you need some time off, zen

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Oh Liz, of course

Mila (milakel): dao:)

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Thing is, we have Guardians on our list we never see or hear of

Zen (zen.arado): yeh true Zen (zen.arado): Hi Dao

Dao Yheng: hi all -- timing's a bit off, but wanted to stop by:)

Aggers (agatha.macbeth): Hello Dao

Mila (milakel): aga, true. i think about 20 are really active.
